Indiana NRCS Invests Dollars to Help Protect and Restore Sensitive Lands

Conservationist Jane Hardisty announced today that protection of open spaces. State and local governments, Indiana's USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service non-governmental organizations and Native American (NRCS) is making funding available to help landowners Tribes that have farmland or grassland protection protect and restore key farmlands, grasslands and programs are eligible to partner with NRCS to protect wetlands across Indiana. The funding is provided farmland through easements. through the Agricultural Conservation Easement Program (ACEP), created by the 2014 Farm Bill to reduce damage from flooding, recharge groundwater, protect critical water resources and wildlife habitat, and restore, enhance and protect habitat for wildlife, and encourage private owners to maintain land for farming. provide Eligible entities must submit applications for the current opportunities. Eligible landowners can choose to enroll funding pool on or before January 12, 2018.

"I cannot overemphasize the benefits of restoring, also have the option of enrolling in 30-year contracts. enhancing and protecting these working agricultural lands and critical wetlands," said Hardisty. "NRCS is WRE (formerly the WRP or Wetland Reserve Program) committed to preserving working agricultural lands to in the last year alone. Option 1: Check with your city trash service to see if they offer curb side pick up. **Option 2:** Drop off at **Organic Resources.** *Note: The fee will be waived for disposal of Christmas trees only.* Trees must be dropped off during business hours: 8:00 AM-3:45 PM (Closed 12:30 PM- 1:00 PM) Address: 4340 Trade Dr., South Bend, IN 46628. **Option 3:** Composting the tree yourself. You can cut it into smaller pieces and add it to your compost pile or stand it up in your backyard to create some attractive bird habitat. You can even decorate it with orange slices, nuts and bird suet to create an organic bird feeder!
