III. REGULAR BUSINESS

- a. **Legislative Updates** –n/a
- b. **Indiana Conservation Partnership Updates** – Jamie Scott is the new President of the IASWCD Board.
- c. **Minutes: August 16, 2016 board meeting**– The minutes were reviewed and approved as presented.
- d. **Treasurer’s Report: (8/17/2016-9/20/2016)** – The treasurer’s reports were both reviewed and approved as submitted.
- e. **Approval of Claims (8/17/2016-9/20/2016)** –A recommendation (Riewe, LaFree) & motion (Cooper, Silvers) was made to approve Claim Nos. 11142-11151 for a total of \$2,772.88 as presented. Both carried

IV. OLD BUSINESS

- a. **St. Joseph Co. Soil & Water Conservation Partnership Staff Written Reports** – The field office & Education reports were presented to the board and reviewed. (Attached). There weren’t any NRCS talking points.
- b. **Committee Reports**
 - i. **Annual Meeting** – Hoffarth updated the board on the plans so far, waiting to hear back from possible entertainment options, she is hoping to have that information for the October board meeting. The committee recommends ticket prices being kept at \$15 like last year, Silvers seconded. A motion (Vandewalle, Silvers) was made. Both carried.
 - ii. **Education** – Ivkovich informed the board that Rick has been requested for 3 Marshall Co School programs (1 swamp stomp, 1 RES field trip, 1 in school program at Culver) and 3 LaPorte Co School programs (2 in school programs at Knapp & Boston schools, and 1 swamp stomp). Glassman has permission from Marshall Co to do programs in their county with their employee attending if her schedule allows. LaPorte hasn’t responded yet. The committee and Silvers recommends and a motion (Silvers, Vandewalle) that he goes ahead with Marshall Co. but wait to hear from LaPorte Co. Both carried. Glassman has 11 Owl Prowls scheduled so far. Oct 1st Glassman has been asked to do a program for the Notre Dame Family Day, a recommendation by the committee & Riewe was made and carried to do this program. Glassman asked for a couple volunteers to help with set up at the St Joseph River Expedition September 29th & 30th.
 - iii. **Marketing** – Cooper passed around samples of the pen and lip balm the marketing committee would like to purchase for upcoming events. The pens are \$275 for 500 and the lip balm is \$99 for 100. The committee and Vandewalle recommends and a motion (Vandewalle, Silvers) was made to release no more than \$500 for the pens & lip balm including set up and shipping. Both carried. Cooper also showed the board a sample of the new legislative notebook style. The new style will be able to be printed in house on 11x14 paper in full color and will include the leveraging sheets, photos of practices implemented in 2016, the CWI grant information with photos, and the 2016 youth education accomplishments. The committee feels this will streamline the information and be better understood by the legislators in the few moments they have to discuss it.
- c. **NRCS Women’s Circle Workshop** – (Flyer attached) Longenecker updated the board on the planning of this workshop. So far between the three counties we have 6 participants (2 from our county, 1 from Marshall and 3 from Elkhart). We still don’t know the expenses but Cooper gave us the contact information to reach out to Farm Credit for a sponsorship.

- d. **IDEA Fall Conference** – Hoffarth updated the board on the planning for the conference. She informed the board that we have been asked to help sponsor since it is in our area this year. Marshall and DeKalb counties have already sent money in to sponsor. A recommendation (Cooper, Vandewalle) and motion (Cooper, Vandewalle) was made to release \$100 to sponsor the conference. Both carried.
- e. **Landfill Inspection** – Longenecker informed the board it is time to complete this inspection again and asked who would like to go along. Silvers volunteered and Longenecker will be in contact with her on a date and time.
- f. **Christmas Party** – Doms asked the board if they would like to have a party this year. It was decided to arrive early at the December board meeting and have refreshments then.
- g. **Headwaters of the Yellow River Steering Committee Meeting** – Hoffarth informed the board that the next meeting will be Friday September 30th at 10:30 am at the Plymouth Library. That is the day of the St Joseph River Expedition and she will be unable to attend and Cooper is unavailable as well. Silvers, Doms or Longenecker will attend if possible.

V. NEW BUSINESS


- a. **Schedules/ Upcoming Events / Any Related Claims** - calendars were handed out explaining upcoming special events & holiday schedules on the back of the agenda.
 - i. **Indiana Watershed Leadership Academy** – Longenecker explained this training and asked if the board would like her to attend. The cost is \$700 which includes any overnight training dates and food. She is able to apply for a scholarship which would cover the total cost of the training. A recommendation (Ivkovich, Silvers) was made to apply for the scholarship and carried. If she doesn't receive the scholarship she will bring it back up to the board to approve the \$700 cost.
- b. **Indiana Woodland Steward** – Hoffarth received in the mail a request to contribute towards printing costs for the Woodland Steward Newsletter to St Joseph County landowners. Currently there are 271 landowners who receive this newsletter at a cost of \$373.98. It was tabled until the October board meeting so more research can be made.

VI. PRIVILEGE OF FLOOR – Thum reminded the election committee of the Dec 1st deadline for any elected supervisor. She also informed the board the next area meeting will be mid-late November or early December, more information will come via e-mails. Straughn informed the board that he was at a function with Commissioner Deborah Fleming and she had only praises to say about our board and the positive things we are doing for St. Joseph County.


VII. ADJOURNMENT – The board meeting adjourned at 7:59 pm.

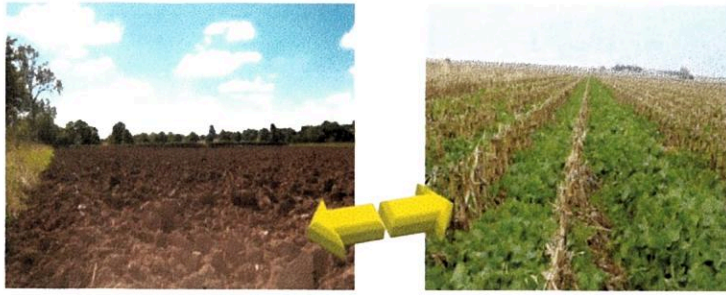

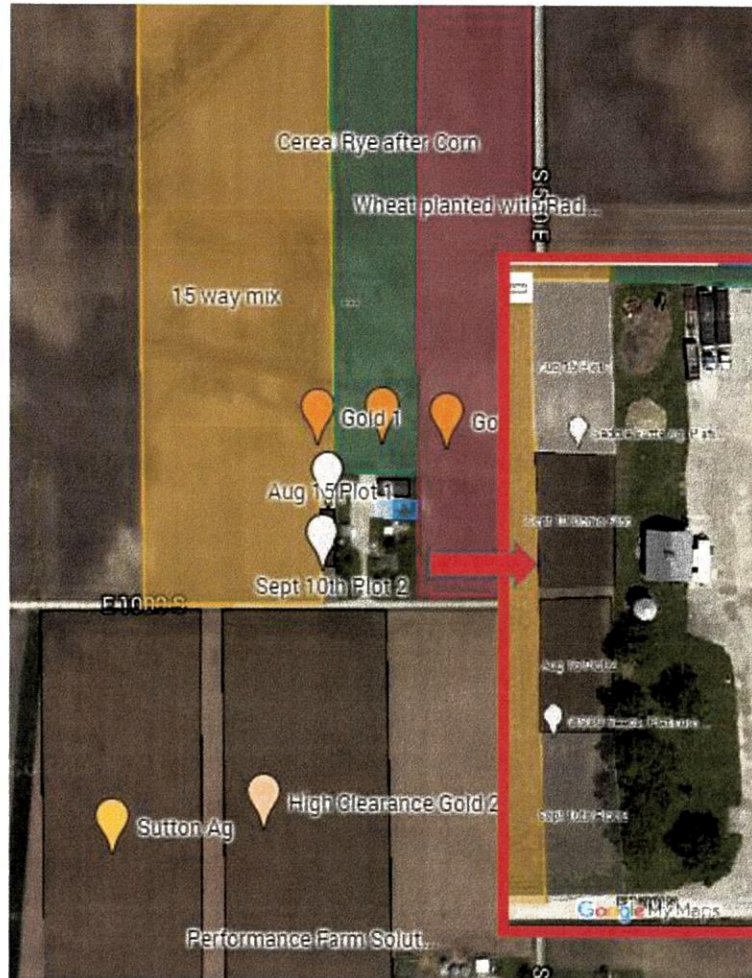
