- d. Treasurer's Report: (7/18/2018-8/21/2018) The treasurer's report was reviewed and approved as submitted by motion (Cooper, Burkholder).
- e. Approval of Claims (7/18/2018-8/21/2018) —A motion (Cooper, Burkholder) was made to approve Claim Nos. 11365-11370 for a total of \$528.77 as presented. Motion carried.

- a. St. Joseph Co. Soil & Water Conservation Partnership Staff Written Reports

# b. Committee Reports

- i. Annual Meeting Hoffarth has reached out to Stephanie McClane from NRCS to be a possible speaker. She hasn't heard back from her yet. She will follow up and report back before the next board meeting. St Hedwig has a new manager in charge of the hall and is asking that we pay the \$500 deposit which will go towards our final amount due. A motion (Cooper, Burkholder) was made to release the \$500 for the deposit. Motion carried.
- c. Women's Learning Circle Longenecker reported the workshop was a success. We had 16 participants attend and they all felt it was an enlightening to learn about conservation planning and restoring lands to native habitats. Total spent was \$355.58 which included supplies, breakfast and lunch, and fees at Potato Creek State Park. This will be divided between St Joseph, Marshall and Elkhart County SWCD's for \$118.52 each county.
- **d. Review Current NRCS MOU** Knepp reminded the board of our MOU with NRCS. This is currently being reviewed and updated since the current MOU expires this year.
- e. CWI 2016 payments Two no-till applications that were pre-approved by the board have completed their practices. 96.5 acres for \$1,447.50 and 174.2 acres for \$2,613 for a total of 270.7 acres. A motion (Burkholder, Vandewalle) was made to release the CWI funds for \$4,060.50. Motion carried. Longenecker let the board know that an application came in for cover crops from an applicant last year. The applicant liked the results from last year and would like to try again this year. Since this is the final year of our grant and having several pollinator habitats still pending we may or may not have the funds from CWI to cover this application. A motion (Cooper, Burkholder) was made to approve the application in the amount of \$1,110.00 and use district funds if CWI funds are not available. Motion carried.

### V. NEW BUSINESS

- a. Schedules/ Upcoming Events / Any Related Claims calendars were handed out explaining upcoming special events & holiday schedules on the back of the agenda.
  - i. Quarterly Supervisors Meeting After some discussion it was decided to have the November board meeting at 9am with the quarterly supervisors meeting immediately following at the Plymouth USDA Service Center office.

- ii. Reschedule January's Board Meeting due to the IASWCD annual conference, it was decided to hold the January board meeting on Wednesday January 16<sup>th</sup> at Farm Credit Services at 9am.
- iii. NE Region Meeting staff and board are unable to attend.
- iv. Environmental Education Association of Indiana Conference a motion (Burkholder, Vandewalle) was made to approve Sablich attending September 28-30 at a cost of \$165 for registration. Sablich would prefer to drive back and forth since it is less than an hour away and use the district van, so no travel expenses will occur.
- v. IDEA Conference a motion (Cooper, Burkholder) was made to release up to \$400 for Hoffarth to attend this conference with hotel and registration fees. All meals are included.
- vi. Locally Led Meeting Longenecker informed the board we will be holding this year's meeting on September 18<sup>th</sup> at 6pm before the board meeting.
- **b.** Clean Water Indiana Grant 2019 Sablich passed out drafts for the 2019 CWI grant. The grant proposal is due September 14<sup>th</sup>. We are asking the board for \$1,500 per year for 3 years of the grant as cash match. Board approved this and the draft to move forward in the application process.
- c. Marshall County 319 Grant Sablich informed the board that Marshall County SWCD is applying again this year for a 319 implementation grant just like last year that wasn't funded. The board approved the collaboration and will send a letter of support to Marshall County SWCD.
- d. Dale Stoner Memorial Fund Dooms informed the board we have received \$500 towards this fund. He is asking that we start to think of a project that would be a permanent fixture like a filter strip or education project that we could have a sign made in Dale's honor.
- VI. PRIVILEGE OF FLOOR Hoffarth included in the packet a flyer for the Marshall County grazing workshop being held on August 24<sup>th</sup>. She also included the scholarship application from the Hoosier Chapter of Soil & Water Conservation Society (attached). Deadline to apply is November 1, 2018. Dooms read a thank you card from the National Association of Conservation Districts for our 2018 contribution.

VII. ADJOURNMENT - The board meeting adjourned at 7:57 pm.

# **FARM BILL**

# **EQIP** and CSP Local workgroups

The Local Workgroups bulletin will be out soon to discuss local resources concerns for the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) and Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP). The bulletin will have a due date of <u>November 2, 2018</u> and require counties to prioritize the highest 10 resource concerns in the county.

Agricultural Conservation Easement Program (ACEP) - Easement Application Due Date Change ACEP applications for the FY-2019 funding period will now be due <u>August 17, 2018</u>. This earlier date will allow the field staff more time to complete ranking and application follow up information. Please get the word out to potential applicants and partners.

# USDA Opens Up Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) Enrollment

CRP is an important component of a suite of programs that help improve natural resources on private lands by encouraging agricultural producers to set aside unproductive, marginal lands that should not be farmed to reduce soil erosion, improve water quality, provide habitat for wildlife and boost soil health.

FSA stopped accepting applications last fall for the CRP continuous signup (excluding applications for the Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP) and CRP grasslands). This pause allowed USDA to review available acres and avoid exceeding the 24 million-acre CRP cap set by the 2014 Farm Bill (current enrollment is approx. 22.7 million acres). New limited practice availability and short sign up period helps ensure that landowners with the most sensitive acreage will enroll. Eligible landowners can sign up by August 17, 2018 at the FSA office. Field offices have been provided the following details:

- There will not be a CRP General Signup in FY18;
  - Existing CRP participants with contracts set to expire September 30, 2018 may enroll
    into a 1-year contract extension. Note this does not apply to CREP since
    enrollment for CREP never ceased and they are continually eligible for re-enrollment
    options.
  - Enrollment for CRP (new enrollments and re-enrollments) will be accepted until August 17 with the following changes:
    - Soil rental rates will be based on the National Agricultural Statistics Service rental rates and are lower than previous CRP rental rates (these new rates do apply to CREP offers not currently signed prior to June 4th)
  - Only the following practices are eligible:
    - CP8A, Grass Waterways, Non-easement, CP9, Shallow Water Area for Wildlife, CP21, Filter Strips, CP21B, Denitrifying Bioreactor on Filter Strips, CP21S, Saturated Filter Strips, CP22, Riparian Buffer, CP22B, Denitrifying Bioreactor on Riparian Buffers, CP22S, Saturated Riparian Buffer, CP23, Wetland Restoration on Floodplain, CP23A, Wetland Restoration, Nonfloodplain, CP27, Farmable Wetlands Pilot Wetland, CP28, Farmable

Wetland Pilot Buffer, CP37, CP39, FWP Constructed Wetland, CP40, FWP Aquaculture Wetland restoration, CP41, FWP Flooded Prairie Wetland

- Several of the incentive payments are not available with this sign up (excludes CREP)
- A CRP Grasslands opportunity is available

### MRBI/NWQI INFORMATION SESSIONS

NRCS is kicking off a new round of Mississippi River Basin Initiative and National Water Quality Initiative projects. There will be opportunities for planning projects in Fiscal Year 2019, and for targeted financial assistance through Farm Bill Programs beginning in Fiscal Year 2020. # NRCS AND FSA NEW AGREEMENT

Through a new agreement between NRCS and FSA, partners and contractors working with NRCS programs will soon have access to print and generate producer farm data reports and subsidiary records for NRCS program purposes. NRCS is working to grant access to those partners who already have ProTracts permissions. State guidance and training materials for getting permissions and using the systems is being drafted. Partners and contractors will be notified when access has been granted.

## COOPERATIVE WORKING AGREEMENTS

The current partnership Cooperative Working Agreements expire on December 31, 2018. The Indiana Conservation Partnership leaders are reviewing the agreement. SWCDs will receive the new agreements soon with a return date of early September.

# NATURAL RESOURCE INVENTORY DATA COLLECTION

Indiana's NRI data collection will begin in August and run through until the end of the calendar year. The State Office cartographic technicians will be working on the data collection. DC's and FSA should be aware they may be contacted by one of us to gather producer specific information, such as, tillage practices, conservation plan and cropping history to name a few.

NRI is the National Resources Inventory, a statistical survey of land use and natural resource conditions and trends on U.S. non-Federal lands. If you have any comments or questions, please contact Rick Neilson at: rick.neilson@in.usda.gov or Ken Streett at: kenny.streett@in.usda.gov.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

An applicant for the scholarship must (a) have successfully completed at least two years of study in an Indiana accredited college by August, 2018, (b) have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5 (on 4.0 scale), (c) be an undergraduate enrolled in an agricultural or natural resource conservation related curriculum, and (d) be working toward his/her first B.S. degree.

Scholarship applicants will be enrolled in such major courses of study as agronomy, biology, soil science, wildlife management, forestry, geography, and environmental management. Other courses of study related to conservation may also qualify. Previous recipients are not eligible for a second Hoosier Chapter scholarship.

### SELECTION

A scholarship selection committee, composed of members of the Hoosier Chapter Soil and Water Conservation Society, will make the selection of winners based on financial need, scholastic achievement, career objectives, and demonstrated leadership in student activities. No Hoosier Chapter member may serve on the scholarship selection committee if related to any scholarship applicant.

### SCHOLARSHIP

One scholarships of \$1000 will be awarded. Recognition of scholarship recipient and presentation of award will be made at the annual meeting of the Chapter held in November.

### DEADLINE

Applications for the scholarship may be emailed or sent by regular mail, and must be received by the scholarship selection committee chairman, or postmarked by **November 1**, **2018**.
