 CALL TO ORDER - On Tuesday September 17, 2019, at 6:35pm a regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors of the St Joseph County SWCD at the Centre Township Branch of the St Joseph County Public Library, South Bend, IN 46614 was called to order by John Dooms, Chairman.

III. REGULAR BUSINESS

- a. Legislative Updates n/a
- b. Indiana Conservation Partnership Updates n/a
- c. Minutes: 8/20/2019 board meeting Minutes were reviewed and approved as presented.
- **d.** Treasurer's Report: (8/21/2019-9/17/2019) The treasurer's report was reviewed and approved as submitted by motion (Burkholder/ Vandewalle). Motion carried.
- e. Approval of Claims (8/21/2019-9/17/2019) —A motion (Cooper/Vandwalle) was made to approve Claim Nos. 11486-11493 for a total of \$2,705.01. Motion carried.

IV. OLD BUSINESS

- a. St. Joseph Co. Soil & Water Conservation Partnership Staff Reports
 - i. Field Office Report The field office report was presented to the board & reviewed. (Attached)
 - ii. NRCS Talking Points Knepp presented the NRCS talking points to the board. (attached).

b. Committee Reports

- i. Annual Meeting Discussion was held regarding the speaker for the 60th Annual Meeting. Hoffarth has contacted several possible donors and letters to our donor list has been sent out as well. As of the board meeting there hasn't been any response back. Discussion was held on confirming to have Chad as our speaker regardless of sponsorships. It was decided to table this until the October board meeting to see if any sponsorships come in.
- c. CWI A motion (Burkholder/Cooper) was made to release \$1,600 for 80 acres of cover crops to be paid through the Clean Water Indiana Grant. Motion passed.
- d. Department Head Meeting Update Sablich reported that the last meeting covered brief department updates, applications are out for the 2019-2020 Youth County Leadership program, cyber security training will be going out to those on the county servers, and discussion on the county having an age friendly community.
- e. Indiana Woodland Steward Hoffarth followed up and received the mailing list which contains 252 names. After some discussion, a motion (Cooper/Burkholder) was made to increase the contribution from \$100 to \$250 to help cover the cost of the newsletter. Motion passed.
- f. Women's Learning Circle Longenecker informed the board that Elkhart County purchased 50 Trees of Indiana books for our participants. A motion (Cooper/Burkholder) was made to release \$185 for breakfast, lunch and 50 Trees of Indiana Books since this workshop furthers the mission of the district. Motion passed.
- g. Cover Crop Workshop Longenecker informed the board that there were 17 total participants with 1 being solely from St Joseph County and a few that have land in both St Joseph and Marshall County. A motion (Cooper/Burkholder) was made to release \$90.94 to cover half the expenses of the workshop. Motion passed.

V. **NEW BUSINESS**

- a. **Schedules/ Upcoming Events / Any Related Claims** calendars were handed out explaining upcoming special events & holiday schedules on the back of the agenda.
 - i. Landfill Inspection (set date) Longenecker will set up a date and contact the supervisors to see who is available to attend.
 - ii. **2020 Meeting Location** Hoffarth informed the board that the libraries website to rent the meeting room has changed and we are no longer able to reserve the room for the whole year. They now only allow 6

months ahead. Discussion was held on different possible locations. Decision was made to continue to look for a new meeting location that we could set the date for the whole year in advance.

- b. **Promotional Giveaways** A motion (Cooper/Vandewalle) was made to release \$355 plus shipping for 500 pens from 4imprint.com. Motion passed. Discussion was held on other promotional items the board might want to order for the annual meeting and other events. (attached)
- c. Cover Crop Books A motion (Burkholder/Cooper) was made to release \$324.45 to purchase 20 Managing Cover Crops Profitability books. Motion passed.
- d. **No-Till Farmer Magazine Subscription** After some discussion a motion (Burkholder/Cooper) was made to offer a one-year subscription to the No-Till Farmer Magazine to producers who are in their first or second years of cover crops and/or no-till at a cost of \$26.85/subscription with a cap of 25 subscriptions per year. Motion passed.
- e. Forestry Education Grant Sablich informed the board that in conjunction with Marshall County SWCD, we are applying for a grant that deals with forestry education. This grant would put together forestry kits that teachers in St Joseph and Marshall County could borrow. A motion (Cooper/Burkholder) was made to move forward with this grant with the cost to our district not to exceed \$1,000. Motion passed. Sablich is working on a second grant for \$500 that would be just for our county to help with the cost of Project Learning Tree.
- f. **Education Supplies** A motion (Cooper/Burkholder) was made to purchase candy for an upcoming Boomer Event not to exceed \$50. Motion passed.
- g. District Laptop/QuickBooks The current district laptop was purchased in 2011 and is starting to show signs of its age (no longer able to hold a charge, freezes while working in programs, and just overall slow). Hoffarth met with a computer expert and received a recommendation based on our current computer and usage. We own the 2011 Microsoft office CD which is compatible on Windows 10, however the QuickBooks 2011 we currently have is not compatible with windows 10 and will need to be upgraded. A motion (Cooper/Vandewalle) was made to purchase an HP i58265U laptop for \$429.99 and 2019 QuickBooks for \$188.64 plus any shipping/handling costs. Motion passed.

DC Talking Points September 2019

FARM BILL

Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP)

Indiana has made excellent progress on obligating FY19 funds for approved EQIP applications. To date we have obligated over 99% of our original allocation of \$20.5 million dollars. Indiana has requested additional dollars to help fund a portion of the remaining preapproved applications.

Indiana has also recently received an additional \$2.4 million to assist landowners on cover crop plantings for prevented planting/flooded fields. These funds were provided as a special funding request due to the wetness and flooding that has occurred in Indiana in 2019.

Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP)

CSP contracts continue to be reviewed for obligation. Indiana has recently received \$1.25 million in additional CSP funds. The additional funds will be used on preapproved but not yet obligated CSP applications.

A sign-up for Grassland Conservation Initiative-a component of CSP has recently ended. This program involves lands with a crop base that are currently in grass and allows the participant to receive a payment to have it remain in grass. Eligible participants were identified by working with FSA and eligible participants have been notified. Approximately \$100,000 dollars will be obligated on 76 applications for CSP-GCI.

Agricultural Conservation Easements Program

Indiana had the most Wetland Reserve Easement enrollments of any state in 2019 with 40 on over 2,600 acres. The full easement allocation for 2019 was \$10.3 million and we expect to obligate 99% into new enrollments and management/repair on existing easements.

MRBI/NWQI Priority Watersheds

NRCS is seeking new priority watersheds for the Mississippi River Basin Initiative and National Water Quality Initiative. MRBI has a primary focus of improving water quality while also restoring wetlands, enhancing wildlife habitat, and sustaining agricultural viability in small watersheds of the Mississippi River Basin. Projects should align with state nutrient loss reduction strategies. NWQI is a joint initiative between NRCS and EPA to address agricultural sources of water pollution, specifically nutrients, sediment and pathogens in priority watersheds. Implementation projects for both MRBI and NWQI must have a watershed assessment that meets NRCS guidelines and targets efforts at the 12-digit HUC level. Applicants can apply for funding to complete a watershed assessment before applying for implementation funding. Proposals are due to Indiana NRCS by September 20. Interested partners should contact Jill Reinhart for proposal guidelines and watershed assessment criteria.

Local Work Groups

Local Work Groups focus on identifying agricultural and natural resource issues existing in their communities and provide information and feedback to direct NRCS farm bill programs, such as EQIP and CSP. Participants can be farmers; private woodland owners; representatives of agricultural and environmental organizations; and agencies carrying out environmental, agricultural, or conservation programs and activities. The LWG is a subcommittee of the State Technical Committee that meets annually to discuss their local natural resource issues and provide recommendations on their top priority concerns to the STC. The deadline for this action is November 1, 2019.

NATURAL RESOURCE INVENTORY DATA COLLECTION

NRI is the National Resources Inventory, a statistical survey of land use and natural resource conditions and trends on U.S. non-Federal lands. Indiana's NRI data collection will begin in early September and run through until the end of January 2020. The soils staff at the state office will collect data. Field office staff and FSA may be contacted to provide producer-specific information, such as, tillage practices, conservation plan, cropping history, etc. If you have any comments or questions, please contact Rick Neilson State Soil Scientist at rick.neilson@usda.gov.

COMPLIANCE STATUS REVIEWS

Status reviews are underway around the state. Completing status reviews is required by law and Indiana USDA (NRCS and FSA) takes this responsibility seriously, but we also use this opportunity to discuss conservation with all program participants. These reviews can educate the landowner about why compliance is required and help them get back on the conservation track and keep them eligible for our programs.

CROP INSURANCE AND COVER CROPS UPDATES

USDA Risk Management Agency recently authorized the grazing, having, and sileage harvest of cover crops (as identified by an ag expert) after September 1, 2019 for this crop year only.

A variance to the Indiana FOTG Cover Crop (340) allows customers to plant corn, soybean, grain sorghum, and/or alfalfa as a monoculture (cover or grazing only) or in a mix (cover, grazing, haying, sileage) and be considered to meet the standard. The cover crop cannot be harvested for seed/grain under any circumstances. The variance is for fiscal year 2019 growing season only.

A variance to the FOTG Tree/Shrub Establishment Standard (612) allows planting of bareroot seedlings after July 1st if the seedlings have been properly stored and they are planted as soon as site conditions are suitable. This is for 2019 only

FFA VOLUNTEERS STILL NEEDED

The FFA National Convention and Expo will be returning to Indianapolis this year and will run from October 30-November 1, 2019. As in years past, NRCS will be supporting the Natural Resources and Environment Judging event and we are asking for volunteer assistance from partnership staff. This event will take place on October 30th from 11AM-2PM at the Indiana State Fairgrounds. Judges are separated into two categories:

Verbal Judging:

Students will be provided a scenario that addresses an environmental/natural resource problem from soils, water, ecosystems and waste management. Teams are required to develop a statement that addresses the questions in the scenario and give an oral presentation justifying the decisions made by the team. Each team will have eight minutes to make their presentation. There will be an additional five minutes given to each team to address questions from the judges.

Teamwork Judging:

While the students are preparing their oral presentations, a group of judges will evaluate how well the team members work together to develop their statement and presentation.

FROM COLLECTING MUSSELS TO USING MUSCLE TO COLLECT GARBAGE

The Mississippi River was literally Chad Pregracke's back yard while growing up near East Moline, IL. The son of educators and river enthusiasts, KeeKee and Gary Pregracke, Chad and his older brother, Brent, spent the majority of their time on, in and around the Mississippi and Illinois Rivers. Between his childhood and first job as a clam digger, it didn't take long before realizing that he didn't like what he saw - above or below the river - and decided to do something about it.

WHAT STARTED AS 'ONE RIVER, ONE PIECE OF GARBAGE AT A TIME' TURNED INTO LIVING LANDS & WATERS FULL TIME

At the age of 17, Chad started making calls to government agencies to notify them of the problem, assuming someone would take care of it. Year after year passed by and the problem only worsened. In 1997, Chad decided that if no one else was going to clean up the river, he would.

In 1998 at the age of 23, Chad founded Living Lands & Waters. Today, the organization has grown to include a full staff and fleet of equipment. The crew averages nine states a year along the Mississippi, Illinois and Ohio Rivers, as well as many of their tributaries. Most recently, Chad expanded the mission of the organization to include Student Educational Workshops, The MillionTrees Project, Adopt-a-River Mile, Invasive Species Removal and The Great Mississippi River Cleanup.

AWARDS, HONORS & A BOOK

Chad's vision, charisma, non-stop work ethic and natural leadership abilities have garnered him an abundance of awards and honors over the years. Most notably, Chad was the recipient of the Jefferson Award for Public Service (America's version of the Nobel Prize) in June 2002. Chad accepted this award in the United States Supreme Court in Washington D.C. with other award recipients Rudolph Giuliani, Bill and Melinda Gates and Lilly Tartikoff. In 2013, he was named CNN's Hero of the Year. Chad is also the author of From the Bottom Up: One Man's Crusade to Clean America's Rivers.

OTHER FUN PROJECTS

Whenever he can get away from his rigorous work schedule, Chad enjoys fishing, skateboarding, snowboarding, windsurfing and recycling used and salvaged materials by incorporating them into new projects!

OVERVIEW OF PROJECTS & PROGRAMS

RIVER CLEANUPS

Living Lands & Waters' community-based river cleanups and Alternative Spring Break (ASB) programs are just two of the projects we host to remove debris from the shorelines & islands of our nation's rivers. Involving the public in our cleanup efforts creates a sense of pride among a community, serves as an educational opportunity about issues confronting our rivers, & provides a way for citizens to become a part of the solution.

Approximately 80% of all garbage collected is recycled through our "Recycle Like a Rock Star" events, scrap metal & tire recycling programs.



ILLIONTREES & ISR



The MillionTrees Project is expanding the oak population one tree at a time. Since 2007, LL&W's staff have distributed and/or planted over 1 million oak saplings in 16 states throughout the country. These trees provide a vital habitat & viable food source for indigenous wildlife, and also increase water quality by filtering pollution and reducing erosion. In 2014, LL&W established a new tree nursery near our home base in Davenport, IA!

LL&W also works to remove invasive plant species from our fragile forests. These species, once introduced, invade ecosystems & proliferate, often to the exclusion of native species. Over the years, LL&W have removed nearly 90 acres of invasive from forested areas in 6 Midwestern states.

DUCATIONAL WORKSHOPS

Free educational workshops for students, teachers, & educators are held on Living Lands & Waters' floating classroom, headquarters & garbage barges. Hands-on programs focus on river ecology, history, navigation, culture, & stewardship.

The floating classroom gives participants the opportunity to experience the river firsthand, learn about its value and importance to our nation, and how they can help preserve it for the future.

To date, we've hosted over 10,000 students/educators! LL&W also conducts educational outreach in the classroom & summer camp opportunities throughout the year.



INPT-R-RIVER WII F & GWRC



For individuals, organizations, companies, and families looking for a truly hands-on way to get involved, the Adopt-A-River Mile program & the Great Mississippi River Cleanup (GMRC) gives volunteers the supplies and guidance they need to host their own cleanups. These programs help sustain LL&W's efforts & give us the opportunity to visit new stretches of river where our efforts and equipment are needed most!

Since 2001, over 244 miles have been adopted, & in the last five years with the help of 8,220 volunteers, over 513,000 lbs of debris have been removed through GMRC events.


