On Friday, February 7th, about 140 people came together at Hedwig Memorial Center to celebrate the St. Joseph County Soil & Water Conservation District's 65th year of conservation. Board chairman Chris Matthys opened the meeting



at 6:30 pm. Following introductions and the treasurer's report was the supervisor election. This year, Marty Lappin was on the ballot. Mr. Lappin has been on the board since 2021 and serves as vice-chairman. The District is pleased to announce he will continue to serve on the Board. The District also appointed a new supervisor, Nathaniel Ness, this year. Both Mr. Lappin and Mr. Ness were sworn in at the Annual Meeting. We were honored to have Councilman Dan Schaetzle and Councilman Randall Figg join us for the meeting and we thank them for swearing in our new supervisors. The supervisor election was followed by a delicious traditional Polish dinner.



Following dinner Mr. Matthys spoke about conservation in St. Joseph County and the District's past year. He then presented the 2025 Friend of Forestry Award. We ended the evening the year's keynote speaker, Matt Meersman. Mr. Meersman is the director of the St. Joseph River Basin Commission and is a competitive paddler. His entertaining talk intertwined educational aspects of watersheds and the St. Joseph River with entertaining and inspiring stories about his canoe racing.


Rain Gardens

Rain gardens are attractive, landscaped areas placed in specific areas to capture rainwater runoff from impervious surfaces such as roofs and driveways. The areas are usually slightly lower than ground level and commonly use native wildflowers and grasses that do not mind being wet or flooded for a short time.

In natural areas, water is slowed by plants, leaf litter and soil and is easily absorbed into the ground. In developed areas, impervious surfaces do not allow the water to seep into the soil. Instead the water runs over the surfaces and into storm drains, picking up pollutants along the way. In some areas, the runoff can cause flooding.

Rain gardens are designed to mimic nature and slow down rainwater with the shallow depression catching the water.

Interested but not sure where to start? We offer free technical assistance to get your rain garden started. Plus, there are two rain garden kits available through our Native Plant Sale with appropriate plants already chosen. Follow the link to the right to read more about those kits!

Students Learn About Native Plants

The SWCD started a pilot project in Spring 2024, giving classrooms in St. Joseph County the supplies necessary to start Black-eyed Susan plants from seed. We worked with 14 classrooms at several schools around the county. Our educator visited the classes and gave a presentation on the importance of native plants, and the students spent the months of April and May growing their plants. Some classes sent the plants home with the students, and one teacher planted the flowers near the front doors of their school!
